## Day by day

### ■ DAY 1

#### Siem Reap, Cambodia

Arrive in Siem Reap, Cambodia's second-largest city, and settle into the well-appointed Raffles Grand Hotel d'Angkor, located near the iconic Angkor Wat.

**Arrival Time:** Arrive before 3:00 p.m. local time.

**Arrival City:** Siem Reap, Cambodia

Stroll through Angkor Ban, a village with some of the oldest remaining traditional Khmer-style wooden homes, and visit Wat Angkor Ban, a living testament to the region's spiritual heritage. Local monks will join you on board *The Jahan* for a special blessing. Later, in the serene village of Prek Bang Kong, visit a family-run silk-weaving workshop to see this centuries-old craft brought to life.

### ◊ DAYS 2-3

#### Angkor

Rise early to watch the sunrise over Angkor Wat. This 12th-century Khmer temple, one of the world's largest religious monuments, is adorned with elaborate bas-reliefs and sculptures. Ride a *tuk-tuk*, or motorized rickshaw, to the walled city of Angkor Thom. Discover the shrines of Ta Prohm and the temple of Banteay Srei. Visit a workshop where local youth are trained in age-old Khmer arts. Enjoy traditional Cambodian music and dance at a beautifully lit private dinner at one of Angkor's temples. Breakfast, lunch and dinner are included on Day 2; breakfast and dinner are included on day 3.

### ◊ DAY 4

#### Steung Trang / Embark Ship

Drive to the bustling town of Steung Trang and embark *The Jahan*, your riverboat home for the next seven nights. Step out onto your balcony to watch as you set sail on a journey along the Mekong River.

### ◊ DAY 6

#### Kampong Tralach / Kampong Leaeng

In Kampong Tralach, ride a traditional oxcart through emerald rice paddies to the Green School, a unique educational institution founded in 2016 that offers free instruction in English, Khmer and computer literacy to children from a wide range of socioeconomic backgrounds. The school's mission is to break the cycle of poverty while fostering community development, with a strong emphasis on environmental education and local stewardship. National Geographic-Lindblad Expeditions has helped build an English-language library here, and the students are always eager to practice their English and share stories with visitors. Later, cruise up the Tonle Sap River to Kampong Leaeng, stopping at homes where artisans shape pottery by hand, and visiting a local farm to learn how palm sugar is harvested and processed.

### ◊ DAY 7

#### Phnom Penh

Discover Cambodia's capital by cyclo, visiting the opulent Royal Palace and the National Museum of Cambodia, home to more than 14,000 artifacts ranging from prehistoric stone tools to stunning sculptures from the ancient Khmer Empire. Gain

insight into the Khmer Rouge era at the Tuol Sleng Genocide Museum. Next, visit the Killing Fields or browse the vibrant Central Market, once the largest market in Southeast Asia. End the day with a mesmerizing Apsara dance performance on board.

## Cruising the Mekong

Take in views of everyday life along the river, attend talks by experts and join the chefs to learn how to cook regional dishes. Cross the border into Vietnam.

◇ DAY 9

## Chau Doc, Vietnam

After cruising along the man-made Tan Chau Canal, board local boats in Chau Doc—an aquaculture hub on the Bassac, the southern branch of the Mekong Delta—to visit a basa catfish farm and weave through lively riverside markets. In town, ride trishaws to the bustling market, brimming with colorful tropical fruits and local delicacies. In the afternoon, relax on board and enjoy engaging presentations as you sail deeper into the Mekong Delta.

◇ DAY 10

## Binh Thanh Island / Cai Be

Board a sampan and glide along the tropical canals of the Mekong Delta to experience the rhythms of rural life. On Binh Thanh Island, set out with local guides to watch farmers produce rattan mats and visit a village temple. In Cai Be, stop at a rice workshop to see traditional sweets being made. Tonight, gather aboard *The Jahan* for a festive farewell dinner.

◇ DAY 11

## My Tho / Disembark Ship / Saigon (Ho Chi Minh City)

Disembark in My Tho and visit the Vinh Trang Pagoda, originally built in 1850. Then journey to Saigon and, on arrival, visit the landmarks of Saigon including a visit to the Bitexco Tower, post office and the Reunification Palace followed by lunch. Continue to the Park Hyatt Hotel to check in. Early this evening meet with a local expert on Vietnam's modern development, and then enjoy dinner at a local restaurant.

■ DAYS 12-13

## Saigon

This morning, visit the Cu Chi tunnel, part of a huge network of tunnels used by the Viet Cong during the Vietnam War. If you wish, visit the War Remnants Museum, which gives a strong view of the war through the eyes of the Vietnamese. The rest of the afternoon and lunch are at leisure. In the evening, you'll take in a performance of water puppetry—a distinctive Vietnamese folk art, practiced here for over 300 years. Dinner is at the hotel.

Depart Saigon on Day 13, arriving home the same day.

To sail along the Mekong River is to experience two fascinating countries and discover how life is led along its banks. There is no better way to travel in comfort and grand style than aboard *The Jahan*. She has large, gracious staterooms and luxurious touches. Built in 2011 from the ground up, she is simply the finest ship on the Mekong River. Every cabin has a private balcony and the ship's public spaces offer a relaxed elegance for your Mekong voyage.

At 230 feet long with four decks, she is an expansive ship with public areas where the expedition community can gather to watch life along the riverbank, with everyone sharing in the experience.

Her public spaces are built for easy gathering of small groups, intimate nooks to escape on your own, and open spaces like the lounge, where we gather daily for Recap, or the top deck, where we can gather together in the shade or sun to watch as cities and villages drift past. The dining room easily accommodates all guests at once for a single seating, with no assigned tables for easy mixing. While the ship is luxurious, life aboard is casual in every regard, and there is no need for formal clothing. And you'll find shipboard services like laundry make packing and traveling more convenient.



# Cabin Categories

## Category 1

### Main Deck: #101-112

These 323-square-foot cabins feature a private balcony with floor-to-ceiling glass doors that let in abundant light. Cabins 103-104 have twin beds (which can be pushed together on request), and #105-112 have queen-size beds. You will find a sitting area and spacious bathroom with glass-walled shower.



## Category 2

### Upper Deck: #201-208

These 323-square-foot cabins feature a private balcony with floor-to-ceiling glass doors that let in abundant light. Cabins 201-202 have twin beds (which can be configured on request), and #203-208 have queen-size beds. You will find a sitting area and spacious bathroom with glass-walled shower.



## Category 3

### Main Deck: #113-114

### Upper Deck: #209-210

Each 376-square-foot cabin has a queen-size bed and a private balcony with floor-to-ceiling glass doors that let in abundant light. There is a television and private DVD player. Each balcony has two sun beds and a table. You will find a sitting area and a spacious bathroom.



## Suites

### Upper Deck: #211-212





# Ship amenities

## Public Areas

Public areas have sweeping views and are fully air-conditioned. Outdoor areas include the terrace deck, with both covered and open-air spaces, a small swimming pool, and a full-service bar. The lounge, located on the upper deck, has a library and facilities for films, slide shows, and presentations. Guests are welcome on the "open bridge" to meet the captain and officers and learn about river navigation.



## Meals

Dining aboard is an extraordinary event daily. Meals are artfully prepared and spotlight Cambodian and Vietnamese cuisine. Continental options are always available. The dining room accommodates all guests for a single seating.

## Cabins

24 outside cabins. All face outside, and all have glass doors and private balconies for enjoying the scenery along the Mekong River and its tributaries. There is a mix of twin-bedded and queen-size bedded cabins. Each has private facilities and hair dryer, individual climate control, music entertainment system and a mini bar.

## Expedition Equipment

Search for rare birds and mammals and explore the tributaries that feed these rivers aboard 10-person skiffs, which feature individual seats with cushions and plenty of legroom. Kayaks offer a quiet way to explore remote, seldom-visited side streams.

## Special Features

The staff and chefs are Vietnamese and Cambodian to offer a window on the cuisines of the region and more opportunities for cultural insight. The boutique has a curated selection of local art and textiles.



## Wellness

Enjoy the spa, which offers a choice of massage treatments, and fitness rooms with steam bath, treadmill, stationary bicycle, and elliptical trainer. Morning tai chi classes are also offered on the Terrace Deck.
